

Seborrheic Dermatitis

Seborrheic dermatitis is a condition caused by reaction of the immune system towards yeast on the skin surface.

- It often appears as red and/or flaky patches
- This condition often affects the scalp (dandruff), on the face around the nose and eyebrows, and on the chest and back
- There are various over the counter (OTC) and prescription strength (Rx) medications to control this condition.

Treatment options for active flares:

- Face:
 - Anti-fungal treatment: apply 1-2 times a day during flare
 Ketoconazole cream (Rx)
 Clotrimazole / Lotrimin cream (OTC)
 - Anti-inflammatory treatment: apply 1-2 times a day during flare □Hydrocortisone 1% cream (OTC)

□<u>Hydrocortisone 1% cream</u> (OTC) □Hydrocortisone 2.5% cream (Rx) □Triamcinolone 0.025% cream (Rx) □Elidel cream (Rx)

• Scalp:

□Fluocinonide 0.05% solution apply 1-2 times a day during flare (Rx)

Treatment options for maintenance (to prevent future flares)

- Scalp:
 - Lather and leave on affected areas for 10 minutes 1-3 times per week
 <u>Selsun Blue Shampoo</u> (OTC)
 Ketoconazole (Nizoral) Shampoo (Rx)
